# Looking out for our tenants

During periods of cold or inclement weather, we like to check in with those tenants who may need a little more care, such as those in sheltered housing, the elderly or vulnerable. It helps us identify any areas where tenants may need extra support.

# Reporting emergency repairs

Emergency repairs are ones which are needed to avoid serious health and safety risk, or prevent serious structural damage to your home.

If you are in doubt, you should phone and give the operator as much information as possible, and they will be able to advise you if your repair is an emergency.



All emergencies should be phoned in on the Freephone number **0800 028 2755** – this service is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

If you need to phone us with an emergency:

- Please have your postcode ready, it helps us to quickly locate your property and confirm that it belongs to ACHA.
- Operators will talk you through the problem and try to find a fix if possible (e.g., tripped fuse switch). If we cannot find a fix we will arrange for

someone to visit you.

- Please remember that we are here to help –
   emergencies can be worrying, but the more information you can give us then the faster we can help you.
- We can't guarantee to complete a full repair when we attend but we will at least make it safe, and provide further support as needed.

The award was used to purchase new fitness equipment to replace their old and much worn equipment. Families who come to the weekly sessions were over joyed, and the children were so excited to try out the new equipment. The award



will benefit them in developing key skills - for example Ball Skills and Gross Motor Skills as well as learning new and fun Games with an emphasis on developing physical fitness.

# Update on ACHA's 10 10 10 initiative

Seven schools in Argyll and Bute have been successful so far this year with their application to ACHA's 10 10 10 scheme. The legacy was set up to recognise the Association's 10th anniversary in 2017, when ACHA's Board agreed to invest £10,000 per year for 10 years in 10 schools in Argyll and Bute, and to work in partnership with Argyll and Bute Council to support young people in particular areas where there are clearly identified needs.

The successful schools are; St Andrew's Primary, Rothesay, Barcaldine Primary, Kilmodan Primary, Colintraive, Small Isles Primary, Isle of Jura, Tighnabruaich Primary, Sandbank

Primary, Dunoon and Strachur Primary.

This year the grants to the schools will help to support a number of different projects and initiatives such as an outdoor laboratory project, a lending library, provision of a music space, design and play led workshops.

The 10 10 10 initiative is open to all local authority schools in Argyll and Bute and details of how to apply and application forms are issued early each year by Argyll and Bute Council. The closing date for applications each year is 31st May.

In 2017, Achaleven Primary School purchased a range of equipment to help their P5 children develop their digital literacy skills. The school applied to purchase Lego wedo, K'nex control and a small robot, called Sphero, that could be programmed using the ipad. Using this equipment enables the children to rotate between digital

technology, following plans and designing their own models.






# ACHA's Christmas and New Year office opening hours


