It only takes 10 minutes for a free and confidential chat with David, Fiona, Garrick or Corrina so don't delay - phone your local ACHA office and ask for an appointment.

It's hard to believe that we are on the verge of entering another winter. The last two years have been challenging with respect to storms and sub-zero temperatures in many parts of Argyll and Bute. Both examples have posed challenges to Association tenants in terms of home contents, of the consequences of burst pipes and storm damage. In the past two winters, temperatures in parts of Argyll and Bute have dropped to as low as minus 17°c and there were incidents of temperatures being below zero for weeks. This has highlighted to all of us the need for adequate home contents insurance. Many, but not enough, tenants have home contents insurance. The consequences of not having insurance can be seen in the damage display boards in the Association's offices. I would strongly recommend to you if you do not currently have home contents insurance, speak to an Association staff member. The Association organises insurance for our tenants and it can be paid in weekly instalments with your rent. While the cost of home insurance may be another bill, the cost of not having it if something goes wrong, as can be seen from the examples of the last two winters, is not worth contemplating.

On a different note, could I thank everyone who participated in the Garden in Bloom competitions this year. The hard work put in resulted in some fantastic displays despite the challenges of the wet weather this summer. Well done and please enter again next year.

The block was originally built in the early 1900's - the first affordable homes in the town which were purpose built for workers. ACHA redesigned the property from 21 homes to 16 to meet the current demand for smaller homes. In addition to this, each home has solar panels to heat hot water and enhanced insulation including sheep's wool, in walls and roof spaces. The work was carried out by Argyll builders, John Brown of Strone Ltd.
