Everyone will be aware from the news that there are big changes ahead to the benefits and tax credit systems. ACHA has its own welfare rights service - the FISH project which over the past two years has helped tenants claim or appeal £3 million in unclaimed benefits and tax credits. We can help you make sense of the changes, find out what you are due now and help explain how future changes by the Government might affect you.

Contact David, Fiona, Corrina or Garrick now for a chat in confidence about what you might be due.

Call your local ACHA office and ask for an appointment - you'll be glad you did.

While the primary objective of the Association's investment work is to improve our 5,100 homes by 2015; new build housing also plays a key part in the organisation's strategy to meet housing need.

The Association, in its short time in existence has built 100 new homes across Argyll and Bute. Currently we are on site with 34 in Campbeltown, 24 in Dunoon and 4 in Lochgoilhead. I am also pleased to announce that the Association has been successful in securing funding from the Scottish Government to assist in the financing of 8 new homes to be built at Scott Terrace in Dalmally. Work on this project is due to start in May.

The second piece of good news is that the Association has also been successful in securing funding from Argyll and Bute Council to assist us in building 8 new homes at Leodamus Place, Port Ellen on Islay. We hope to start work on this project in September. Both of these projects will allow desperately needed affordable homes to be built in both villages. At the present time there are over 4,000 applicants on waiting lists in Argyll and Bute, looking for a home to rent. It is therefore imperative that in partnership ACHA, the Scottish Government and Argyll and Bute Council bring together the sum of our parts to try and meet this need. The Association is committed to doing all it can to build for the future. Presently we have the potential to deliver over 800 new homes across Argyll and Bute on sites we own or have affordable development agreements. The challenge is, in these difficult financial times, to deliver the resources to build. The Association will continue to make the case for investment which is vital to the future of housing and economic needs of the area.

ACHA has been operating a factoring service to private owners over the last few years. This is a service which enables maintenance and repairs to be carried out to common parts of buildings which are shared among private owners and ACHA.

ACHA was approached recently by tenants at Glenside, Campbeltown where they were having problems arranging for the maintenance of a large common drying green, used by 24

households. ACHA consulted all the tenants on this and it was agreed that from April, ACHA would organise a grass cutting contract and a small weekly service charge would be paid by the tenants. This is a pilot that ACHA hopes may be used elsewhere.

All your comments are included in each report to the Board so they can see what you've said.

ACHA consulted with all 5,115 tenants during January of this year on the proposed rent increase of 6.6% for 2012.

We received in total, only 3 responses to the consultation and these responses were passed to the ACHA Board when it considered the rent increase for approval at its February Board.

After careful consideration, the Board approved an increase of 5.8% which will be added to rents from April 2012.





A new playpark at Bayview, Machrihanish on the Kintyre peninsula has just been completed. A local residents group called LOAF were successful in obtaining funding and ACHA contributed to this as part of our Play Area Strategy. Congratulations to all those whose hard work paid off.

32 new homes at former Park Square site, Campbeltown

In our Summer 2011 edition we reported the official opening of the site for new homes at the former Park Square site in Campbeltown. Work began in September 2011 to build 32 new homes, employing local tradesmen through MacLeod Construction Ltd. The site looks across to Aqualibrium (just seen in the left of the photo) and the sea front. The Council will begin to construct the new road to give better access to the harbour which will be of benefit to the economy in Campbeltown and Argyll and Bute.
